Introduction

The northern part of the island belongs to the United Kingdom (Northern Ireland), while the rest forms the Republic of Ireland (Encyclopaedia Britannica, 2024).

3. Main Characteristics (Climate, Culture, Traditions)

Ireland has a temperate oceanic climate, with mild temperatures and frequent rain throughout the year. This constant rainfall keeps the fields very green, which is why Ireland is

known as “the Emerald Isle” (Encyclopaedia Britannica, 2024). Irish culture has strong Celtic roots and is well known for its traditional music, played with instruments such as the fiddle and the tin whistle, and for its folk dancing. One of the most important traditions is Saint Patrick's Day, celebrated every year on March 17th, when people around the world wear green to honour Ireland's patron saint (Tourism Ireland, 2023).

4. Famous People from the Country

Ireland has produced many world-famous writers, including the poet W. B. Yeats, who won the Nobel Prize in Literature, and the novelists James Joyce and Oscar Wilde. In music, the rock band U2, led by the singer Bono, is known internationally. More recently, Irish actors such as Saoirse Ronan and Cillian Murphy have become famous in the film industry (Encyclopaedia Britannica, 2024).

5. Famous Landmarks and Tourist Attractions

One of the most visited natural attractions in Ireland is the Cliffs of Moher, a line of tall sea cliffs on the Atlantic coast. In the capital, tourists visit the Guinness Storehouse and Trinity College, home of the famous medieval manuscript known as the Book of Kells. Another popular tourist route is the Ring of Kerry, a scenic road with beautiful views of the coast and the countryside (Tourism Ireland, 2023).
